FACULTY & SEMINAR DESCRIPTION

Mike McGuire is a Canadian Registered Safety Professional (CRSP) and has been a member of the Health Care Industry in Ontario for more than 17 years. His experience comes largely from the diagnostic laboratory environment of MDS Laboratories and he currently works in the Faculty Health & Safety Office of McMaster University in Hamilton. During his time as the Regulatory Resource of MDS, the Ontario Laboratory Accreditation (OLA) requirements were introduced and the Reference Laboratory of MDS served as a pilot implementation site. He has interacted with inspectors from many Canadian Provincial and Federal Ministries and participated in NY State and CAP accreditation inspections.

This seminar is intended to meet the need for laboratory personnel to keep up-to-date and informed of current safety issues. Mike will examine the Ontario Laboratory Accreditation requirements and describe how to establish and maintain a system to comply with them.

The scope of this seminar will incorporate the following topics:

Participants will have the opportunity to discuss additional regulatory and industry requirements for the Health Care Industry. Participants will review the application and management processes for Certificates of Approval for Air and Fire Plans, and assess how a Chemical Hygiene Plan applies to laboratory operations.
